- Fr. Harman and Fr. Michael hosted March Through Lent discipleship evenings on the 5 Wednesdays of March 2023, which included take-home Lenten Tool Kits, adoration, confession, evening Mass, soup supper, fellowship, and a Lenten talk.
- We welcomed 4 new parishioners into the Church in 2022-2023. They include Samantha Blanchette, Ava Campos, Zackary Hurren, and Kelsey Clark.
- Our 2023 Parish Directory was distributed in June on the Feast of St. Anthony and included close to 500 families photographed.

### St. Anthony Highlights This Past Year

### Year in Review

- In January 2023, our parish and schools launched an updated website for stanthony.com. This new website provides a fresh look with easier navigation and increased security.
- The St. Anthony Spring Gala and Hall of Fame was held on March 25, 2023. Inductees for the Hall of Fame Class of 2022 included Art Willenborg (Alumnus '53), Irene Koester (Faculty '69), Ron & Madonna Hakman (Friends of St. Anthony), and the 2007 & 2008 Ladies' Golf Teams and the 2009 Men's Golf Team (Athlete/Team).
- In its sixth and potentially final year, the Illinois Invest in Kids Act has provided \$166,982 in scholarships to 38 high school students and \$205,350 scholarships to 102 grade school students for the 2023-2024 school year. Seven (7) high school students and 18 grade school students remain on the waitlist. Tax credit donations towards the Invest in Kids Act provide scholarships to students at St. Anthony Schools. Thank you to those that donated to the Invest in Kids Act through their 2023 tax returns, allowing these scholarship opportunities to occur. Donations towards the 2023-2024 school year can be made until November 2023. This is the final year for the Invest in Kids Act, sunsetting on December 31, 2023, unless state legislators vote during the fall veto session to extend the deadline.
- St. Anthony Parish provided \$34,127 to 17 school families through our parish scholarship program for 2023-2024 school year.
- The grade school elevator supply piping required repairs and replacements, valued at more than \$13,000.
- The grade school roof was replaced on May 26-27 by Mid-State Construction & Roofing for \$180,568, carrying a 50-year life and 25-year labor warranty, paid out of the parish operating funds.
- The high school gym bleachers received new chair seats, donated by the St. Anthony Booster Club.
- We replaced 80 desktop computers in the grade school computer lab and classrooms, plus replaced 31 grade school teacher iPads and 20 high school teacher iPads as part of our technology long-range plan.
- Indoor security cameras were upgraded at both the parish center and church with outdoor security cameras added as part of our security long range plan.
