

The Eucharistic Prayer is the high point of the Mass. Have you taken time to really think about what these prayers are saying?

Our Gospel Reading John 2:13-25 Cleansing of the Temple



- Jesus cleansed the Temple because He was "consumed with zeal" for the house of God. What areas of our life need to be "cleansed" or "purified" in order to love God all the more?
- People began to believe once they saw the signs that Jesus was doing. Are we attentive to the many signs in our life with which God is trying to win us toward His
- "Stop making my Father's house a marketplace," Jesus said. Have we viewed the living God more like a genie or a cop than a loving and providential Father?

Lenten Regulations

- 1. ABSTINENCE Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- 2. FAST Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed.

3. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.
