LENT.

"From the Pastor's Desk"

Dear St. Anthony Parish Family:

This Sunday afternoon, our second graders make their first Reconciliation, and next Sunday, March 17, we will have our Parish Lenten Reconciliation Service. I thought perhaps it would be helpful to spend a few words on the importance of this sacrament and preparing to receive it.

Jesus' fundamental mission was to reconcile us to the Father and save us from our sins. His one offering on the Cross is the means of that salvation, but the sacraments are our connection to those means. We do not experience Jesus in any closer or more tangible way that through the connection He gave to the Apostles, and therefore the Church, to each generation by the sacraments. What began in us in Baptism is renewed, as we need it throughout our life, in the other sacraments. The Eucharist and Reconciliation are those sacraments which renew God's grace in our lives. And we need them because we are weak, forgetful and sinful. None of us are exempt from the weakness of our human condition, and God desires to be present to us. The Church teaches that we should receive Reconciliation at least once a year, and at any time when we are aware of serious, or mortal, sin. Perhaps it is time for your yearly confession!

While it can be humbling to confess our sinfulness, it is also tremendously freeing! To have our sins forgiven, just by asking and speaking honestly, is a tremendous blessing in the Church's life. (Who else forgives us just by our asking...no repayment, no gift, no shame? Not many!) If our fear or pride stands in the way, perhaps the giving up of those to God is our greatest gift and spiritual advancement.

The best way to begin is to examine our lives and recall the acts, thoughts, or omissions which take us away from God and separate us from true union and peace with others. Most often our sins are the misplaced desires or shortcuts to happiness: we may overindulge, we may seek to control, we may have trouble forgiving (others or ourselves!), we may squeeze God out of our lives or fill our lives up with something else. Reconciliation allows us to be made whole and at peace.

Hope to see you next Sunday for confessions which will begin at 3 p.m.



Lenten Regulations

- 1. **ABSTINENCE** Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- 2. FAST Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed.

3. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.




