

"From the Pastor's Desk"

Dear St. Anthony Parish Family:

This afternoon we will have our Parish Lenten Reconciliation Service at 3 p.m. with six priests hearing confessions. I hope you will take advantage of this opportunity.

I have had a few inquiries regarding funeral rites and cremation in recent weeks. I think a few points can be clarified as to why the Church asks us to do what we do for funerals. A first point would be the encouragement to have your requests for the Funeral Mass and burial properly documented, so that your wishes can be carried out. On more than one occasion, a very faithful Catholic has not had a funeral Mass celebrated due to the fact that the family may no longer be active in the practice of the faith. The Church or funeral home is not able to change the plans made by families if there have not been instructions left in one's will or pre-arrangement needs with the funeral home. Below are a few excerpts from our diocesan statutes on the celebration of funeral rites to help see why we reverence the body of the deceased and why some things are not allowed for the celebration. Instead of being viewed as prohibitions, it is vital to see these requirements as the way to give proper honor and respect to the body. Some well-intended practices could inadvertently lead to unintended disposal of one's bodily remains.

"While the Church clearly prefers and urges that the body of the deceased be present for the funeral rites, cremation is permitted even before these rites are celebrated. The cremated remains of a body shall be treated with the same respect given to the human body from which they come. If the Catholic Church's desire concerning cremation is not respected, public funeral rites shall not be celebrated. The vessel shall be dignified and worthy for holding the cremated remains of the body. In the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois, it is permitted to celebrate any of the funeral rites in the presence of the cremated remains of the body. All of the cremated remains of a body shall be interred following the Rite of Committal. At no time and in no way shall the cremated remains be divided, separated, or interred in more than one place. Common practices which are not consistent with the above policy include: scattering ashes on bodies of water, from the air, or on the ground; sending cremated remains of the body into space; keeping cremated remains in the home of a friend or relative of the deceased; dividing the cremated remains among several relatives or friends; and putting the cremated remains into jewelry and the like. Aside from the issue of the respect due to cremated remains, a number of practical problems arise with such practices: urns or vessels placed in homes could be stolen or damaged; the purpose of the urn could be forgotten by heirs of the original holder and the urn and contents could be sold at a garage or yard sale; cremated remains could be stored in an unsuitable place like an attic, basement storeroom, garage, or storage unit. Interment of cremated remains should not be unduly delayed following the funeral rites."

We have had a great turnout each week for our "Lent and Learn" sessions on Wednesday. We have one more on March 20. I pray you have a blessed week.


