"From the Pastor's Desk"

Dear St. Anthony Parish Family:

As we proclaimed at Easter, The Lord has Risen indeed! While we rejoice in 50 days of Easter, this Sunday we celebrate the receiving of the Lord's mercy as He appeared to His disciples. The Acts of the Apostles, from which we read all during the Easter season, encourages us to live with the joy that Christ's Resurrection means for our own eternal life. We, as his believers in the Church, are commanded to announce this joy in our faith for our lives.

You will be beginning to hear the rally call to be a part of the campaign we are beginning for endowing our St. Anthony Schools: Securing our Future. This campaign is in conjunction with campaigns which every parish in the diocese is undertaking. We have identified that the time and circumstances are right for us to focus on building up the St. Anthony Educational Trust. This trust was begun in 1995 and has never had a public campaign. Over the years, gifts and bequests have offered more than \$3.5 Million to assist in the mission of our schools. We believe that the time is right now, based upon our growth and our sturdy parish situation, to make a bold move to secure the possibility of Catholic education for all of our parish who wish to utilize it. Many of you have already been contacted to make a gift, whose totals we wish to raise in excess of \$5.5 Million over a five year pledge. You will be hearing from us in the mail and on the weekend Masses of April 20-21 on the details of the campaign. I cannot put it more succinctly or sincerely as this: Only by sacrifices have our schools thrived to be the blessing they are. Only by our sacrifices now can we ensure that the sacrifices future families want to make for Catholic education can be met.

This week I will return to the North American College in Rome, where I had served for nine years, for their annual gathering and fundraiser, the Rector's Dinner. It will be a joy to see students, priest faculty with whom I served, and our benefactors. I will return at the end of next week.


