"From the Pastor's Desk"

Dear St. Anthony Parish Family:

This weekend you have heard me, from the pulpit, describing our "Securing the Future" Campaign for our St. Anthony Schools. As I mentioned to you, I hope and pray that you will find this endeavor worthy of your sacrificial support, and that you will join me in making a pledge each of the next five years so as to help our families meet the sacrifice they make to send their children to our schools. We can do nothing alone, but almost anything together! We have great expectations that this campaign will exceed our goal, but we need you to make that happen. I truly meant what I said, that the dollar amount is not as important as the participation amount. This is because we desire that everyone find value and support of the mission of our schools. Our world and our community need the young men and women our Church helps form!

You have probably heard some things about the National Eucharistic Congress, which will be held in Indianapolis this summer, the culmination of our Eucharistic Year. We are pleased to be invited to be one of the final pilgrimage spots on the route, which will bring a Eucharistic Procession from the West Coast to Indianapolis. This is a uniquely historical event for us! While we are still working on the details, we do know that Effingham will host this pilgrimage on Thursday, July 11 and Friday, July 12. Sacred Heart Church will host an event Thursday evening, and we will host an event with St. Anthony Hospital, on Friday, July 12. Friday's event will begin in the morning (8:30 or 9 a.m.) outside St. Anthony Hospital and then we will process with the Eucharist to St. Anthony Church for Mass. This should be quite an event which I hope you will want to experience, so please mark your calendars for the morning of July 12. Stay tuned for further information.


Attend the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage coming to cities in our diocese – You are invited to a once -in-a-lifetime experience being


