"From the Pastor's Desk"

Dear St. Anthony Parish Family:

As we celebrate the Ascension of our Lord this weekend, we look to the climax of the Easter Season next week and Pentecost. I ask you to reflect on this reality of our faith for you this week. Mary and the Apostles spent the time between the Ascension and Pentecost in prayer in the Upper Room. See the Acts of the Apostles, Chapter 1: 12-14. They spent this time awaiting the Gifts of the Holy Spirit. Might you spend time this week in prayer before we celebrate Pentecost next weekend asking God to make you aware of where you need the strength, wisdom, courage and faith to be an even more faithful and joyful disciple? I urge you to do that and to implore the Spirit to guide me and us together as a parish to do his will without fear and with joy!

A few people have asked for a written version of my words last weekend about the Educational Trust Campaign. To the question, "Why give to a trust?": It is important to know where this money goes and what it will do. Unlike other campaigns we have done in the past, which go to fund a specific project or construction, where the funds are raised and then spent, this Campaign will fund and grow the St. Anthony Educational Trust. The money raised will be invested in the trust, which is a separate entity from St. Anthony Parish, Schools, or the Diocese. The trust is built to fund St. Anthony Schools alone. The fund has given back over \$1.4 million to the schools since its inception. But we desire with this campaign to take the trust from \$5 million to over \$10.5 million. In doing so, the annual interest distribution will be of real value to assist with keeping tuition lower for all and assisting families in need. Having an average of over 8% annual return, the fund will provide real assistance to families each year, and still grow. When this campaign is over, and the money is annually dispersed, what we have done over these five years will still be there, and with more. So you can see why we correctly call the campaign "Securing our Future." Please help us do so.

Finally, make sure you reach out and thank your mother on this Mother's Day. She had an impossible job to do, and you are who you are in great part due to her! Thanks to all of our moms.

Securing Our Future Campaign Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

Q: When was the Educational Trust created? How has it performed over the years?

A: The St. Anthony Catholic Church Educational Trust was established by a passionate parishioner in 1995 for the long-term benefit of St. Anthony Schools.

Since 1995, the trust has distributed more than \$1,483,382 directly to St. Anthony Schools.

Our goal is to continue to grow the trust to hold more than \$10.5 million in assets in the next ten years. We will continue to contribute up to 5% of assets to help offset the costs of Catholic education at St. Anthony Schools.

Q: How does a Trust work?

A: A trust is a legal arrangement to ensure assets go to specific beneficiaries. Assets are put into the trust account, and trustees administer those assets. Beneficiaries are those who eventually receive some or all of the assets in the trust.

For the St. Anthony Catholic Church Educational Trust, gifts of cash, stock, or tangible assets are donated into the Educational Trust by donors, such as yourself. The trustees of the Educational Trust manage those gifts. Most of the time, managing gifts means investing in stocks, bonds, or securities. For real estate or tangible assets, the trustees determine the best means for holding those assets.

St. Anthony Schools are the beneficiaries of the Educational Trust. The schools receive a distribution from the Educational Trust each year. This distribution is a percentage of the value of the trust and intended to be less than what the trust makes off of its investments each year. The Educational Trust bylaws state that up to 5% of the trust assets can be distributed to the St. Anthony Schools each year. By setting this threshold, it allows the trust to continue to grow and offer distributions to the schools into the future.

Q: Who benefits from the Educational Trust?

A: Direct benefits from the Educational Trust are received by school families that receive tuition assistance through the St. Anthony parish scholarship program. These families are able to attend St. Anthony Schools at a reduced tuition rate.

Benefits from the Educational Trust are also felt by every family choosing St. Anthony Schools. The distributions from the Educational Trust offset the costs of operating St. Anthony Schools, and, in turn, keep tuition affordable for all families.


