“From the Pastor’s Desk”

Dear St. Anthony Parish Family:

I have to laugh at part of the very real human struggle revealed in both the First Reading from the Book of Numbers and the Gospel selection from St. Mark for this Sunday. In them, people approach Moses and Jesus with a light complaint that some are speaking about them who do not seem to be “authorized” to do so. This reveals part of our human condition of “belonging” as well as what might be a hesitancy to give witness to God in our lives. Moses’ response is particularly striking: “Would that all were prophets and spoke this way!”

As these two scenarios offer a glimpse into the reality of our nature, they also offer a challenge. It can be tempting as Catholics to be passive and only receivers of the faith, and not accept the command to be witnesses to Christ and the Church. But in fact, all of the baptized, not just the clergy or those trained in theology, are called upon to be living witnesses to the faith. Our families, our friends, our co-workers and our neighbors are all people whom the liveliness of our faith (or perhaps lack of liveliness) affects. We don’t have to offer them high theology or in-depth personal reflection, but expressing the joy and consolation that our faith brings us is a powerful and effective witness to others. An invitation to join us at Mass, asking a young person if they have ever considered a religious vocation...these are a few of the ways in which mustering a small amount of courage can have an impact on the Church’s future!

Let us ask the Lord in prayer this week to let us step into the role of witness. I hope you have a good week!

Prayer Campaign for LIFE

Sept. 25 – Nov. 3

Our parish will soon be participating in the annual "Prayer Campaign for LIFE", 40 days focused on building a pro-life culture. We will be joining people of faith across our nation to pray, fast, and serve to end abortion and to fight assisted suicide.

God heard the pro-life prayers of our nation, and blessed us by overturning Roe v. Wade in 2022. What a huge victory! We have the wonderful opportunity to pray in thanksgiving for this gift.

Unfortunately, the average number of abortions committed in our state increased by over 1,300 per month after Roe was overturned. People in surrounding states view our state as an abortion "haven" since Illinois has no abortion restrictions. We have much to pray for!
