

"From the Pastor's Desk"

Dear St. Anthony Parish Family:

I pray that Christmas has been and continues to be a blessing to you and your family. Fr. Jayke and I thank you for your many kind words, Christmas greetings, and plentiful treats to celebrate the season! As we prepare to enter a new year this week, we certainly have many things for which to be grateful.

This weekend, as we did last year, we are placing a special focus on the Crisis Nursery here in Effingham. They have provided information about their work which is included in this bulletin. I asked them to come on the week of the Feast of the Holy Family, to solicit support from us, remembering that the family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph found themselves in need and relying on the help of others. They traveled to a town with no room in the inn and they fled to Egypt to avoid Herod. I am proud of the good work which you and our community does to save children from abortion, and we also must offer assistance to mothers in need to continue our pro-life mission. This nursery has saved children from the unfortunate results which crisis and struggle can bring to families in need. I hope you can be supportive. You can return any gift to this cause in the next week's collection.

We will be hosting a prayer service a week from Monday, January 6, which is near the beginning of the legislative session for the State of Illinois, at 5:30 p.m., to pray for all of our elected officials and lawmakers. Of concern for this session again is the attempt to legalize assisted suicide. This event was well attended last year, so I would like to offer it again. We will have time for Eucharistic Adoration, a litany for the protection of life and cause of religious liberty, and freedom of religious conscience. Please plan to attend, for it is more fruitful to pray than simply to complain about that which frustrates us!

January 1, the celebration of Mary, Mother of God, is a Holy Day of obligation. We will offer Masses December 31 at 5:30 p.m. and on January 1 at 8:00 and 10:00 a.m. There are **no** Masses on January 2.

Crisis Nursery offers a unique and nurturing space equipped with safe hands and open hearts to all children and families in need. A crisis can happen to anyone. For that reason, there are no income or demographic guidelines. The Nursery's services are free and open to any family or child. While the Nursery is located in the city of Effingham, services are be available to all surrounding counties including but not limited to: Fayette, Jasper, Cumberland, Clay, Coles, Marion, and Shelby Counties.


