## "From the Pastor's Desk"

Dear St. Anthony Parish Family:

The last few weeks have brought some media and political points to the forefront as includes our Catholic Church outreach and the trimming of federal spending. It can be hard to distinguish truth from political exaggeration at times. Our Metropolitan Archbishop, Cardinal Blase Cupich recently wrote:

"Here are the facts. The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops receives federal grants to assist in refugee resettlement. This partnership between church and government has been in place since Congress enacted the U.S. Refugee Admissions Program in 1980. The U.S. government invited us then to partner with them in this work and, over this half-century, we have done so effectively and efficiently. Annual audited statements show that these funds are exclusively used to resettle and serve migrants and refugees. Special attention is given to the vulnerable, particularly minors and those at risk of human trafficking. When a Catholic agency accepts such a grant, it agrees to carry out services on behalf of the government. The same goes for any charity that receives federal, state or municipal dollars to help the underserved. It's not unusual for government disbursements to cover only part of the total cost of the service provided, in which case the charity makes up the difference from donor funds. The claim that the church is engaged in charitable work to accrue revenue, as has been suggested (recently and many years ago, by nativists who sought to exclude Catholics from public life), is simply false. Moreover, it belies basic understanding of a key mission of the Catholic Church. Christ himself commanded us to serve those in need, regardless of their proximity or national origin."

It would appear that there are many federally funded programs which are objectionable and wasteful, and for which the current administration's desire to trim or cut is only appropriate. But Catholic Charities and Catholic Relief Services do not "get rich" for the work that they do....and in fact often do the work more efficiently than the federal government could. Additionally, one must be able to make the moral distinction, say, in offering assistance to a person who is not a legal immigrant; that there is a big difference between helping someone break the law, and helping someone who has broken the law. As a Church we do not and should not help people break the law, but also must never turn our back on someone who has done so who is in genuine humanitarian need. These clarifications in difficult issues are crucial.

You will notice boxes in the vestibule in the back of Church for collecting Palm Branches. Please bring them in no later than Sunday March 2, so that they can be burned for the Ashes we will use on Ash Wednesday March 5.

## **Lenten Regulations**

**1. ABSTINENCE** – Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

**2.** FAST – Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids (including milk and fruit juices) are allowed.

**3**. To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.


