### "From the Pastor's Desk"

Dear St. Anthony Parish Family:

We have all watched with sadness of the suffering involved in the war in Gaza. Many innocent people face starvation. It is not easy for us to sort through and make sense of the political causes and ramifications of this this conflict, conflict in a part of the world which seems to be a way of life. But that should not prohibit us from action to assist the suffering. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops have worked to ensure a dependable means to allow us to offer real assistance to those in need. Bishop Paprocki has asked parishes to come together to participate in this assistance. Here is his recent letter to priests.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our Church mourns the terrible suffering of Christians and other innocent victims of violence in Gaza and surrounding areas who are struggling to survive, protect their children, and live with dignity in dire conditions. The Holy Father continues to call for a cease fire and for aid to enter the territory, noting with great sorrow that "Gaza is starving."

The Catholic Near East Welfare Association is there providing vital emergency humanitarian relief and psychological care for the sick, malnourished and wounded. Given the extraordinary nature of this crisis, The Most Reverend Timothy P. Broglio, President of the USCCB, has asked our Diocese to take up a special collection to provide humanitarian Relief and pastoral support for our affected brothers and sisters in Gaza and surrounding areas in the Middle East and send donated funds to CNEWA. This organization has well-established partnerships with the Catholic Church in the region which allows them to respond quickly and efficiently.

The situation in Gaza and across the Middle East cries out for the assistance of the Catholic community of the United States. Please prayerfully consider supporting this special collection.


