“From the Pastor’s Desk”

Dear St. Anthony Parish Family:

It's always great to share good news. We found out just before Christmas that we have been approved for a grant of \$450,000 from the State of Illinois for the Non-Profit Security Grants! That's \$150,000 each for the parish, the high school, and the grade school, which is the largest award we could receive. The approvals include the following upgrades:

Parish:

- Bollards or barriers at the entrances to prevent forced vehicle entry.
- Fragment Retention Film (FRF) on ground floor windows of the parish center, rectory, and church (does not include stained glass windows)
- Expanded exterior security camera coverage to eliminate blind spots

High School

- Replace door handles/knobs on all classroom doors. This addresses 2 things - accessibility requirements plus proper lockdown in active intruder situations.
- Expanding our key fob system throughout the school, allowing us to properly lock down the classroom wing during the school day.
- Bollards or barriers at the entrances to prevent forced vehicle entry.
- Expanded interior and exterior security camera coverage to eliminate blind spots

Grade School

- Fencing, bollards or barriers around the playground and at the entrances to prevent forced entry.
- Fragment Retention Film (FRF) on ground floor windows and entrances.

We have 3 years to complete the projects. As with the state of IL, getting our bids approved and receiving the funds will be a process. Whatever the process, we're pretty excited to have the opportunity for these upgrades! Carrie Koenig deserves our thanks for all of the preparation and grant writing effort and for Mr. Rinker and Mr. Feaday, our principals, for their work in helping assess our needs.


