“From the Pastor’s Desk”

Dear St. Anthony Parish Family:

As we closed off the calendar year 2025, I wanted to draw your attention to the summary of giving to the parish for the year. Many of you chose to make your offering at the end of the year, so the numbers which you may follow in the bulletin from week to week do not always give the whole picture of the average of contributions. Since our fiscal year is July to June, but your tax year is the calendar year, it is important to keep those cycles in mind. Through 27 of the 52 weeks of our fiscal year, the general parish giving is up over \$85,500 our goal. So, thank you, as that is good news! But since a good percentage of giving comes at the end of the calendar year, our “bump” has already taken place. To remain on track for the fiscal year, which ends June 30, we ask that you continue your generous ways, and perhaps as the cost of everything increases a little each year, consider your own “bump” in giving if God has blessed you financially in the past year. I am grateful for your generosity.

We have been journeying this past fall and winter with several candidates for Baptism and Full Communion in the Catholic Faith through the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults, (OCIA). It appears that at our Easter Vigil, we will have many adults and several children to initiate into the faith. You may have recognized them at the 9:15 a.m. Masses on Sundays, as they gather with us before their weekly catechesis. But beginning on Sunday, February 22, with their Rite of Entrance and Sending and then with the various Scrutinies each week, you will see them as a group, leading up to their Baptism and/or Full Initiation with Confirmation and Holy Communion at the Easter Vigil April 4. Please begin praying for them on their journey. I want to thank Deacon Joe Emmerich, Joe Sudkamp and Fr. Jayke, who have been helping teach them each week.


