Our CSW Scripture theme is John 14:6 “I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me” Each day a different speaker will share with all high school students their personal witness about their Catholic faith: why they love being Catholic or chose to become Catholic, how they have encountered Christ, and why the Church matters in their life. The goal of our school’s mission is to help students encounter authentic witness of faith, reflect on their own relationship with God and walk away with a clearer understanding of why being Catholic matters.

On Thursday, January 29th at 10 am Bishop Paprocki along with priests of the Deanery will celebrate Mass in the high school gym for the students and faculty from the various Catholic schools in the Deanery.

Students in grades 5 thru 8 from St. Michael, Sacred Heart, and St. Anthony will remain at the high school and be divided into groups to experience a variety of high school activities given by teachers and staff members. Thus, giving the grade school student a little taste of what it means to be a Catholic high school student at St. Anthony High School.
